**Respectable Sins** Jerry Bridges examines the ramifications of what constitutes sin. We may focus on major sins while brushing aside the "small" or "acceptable" sins that we are guilty of because we live in a fallen world. But, how do we deal with subtle sins such as jealousy, pride, anger, a lack of thankfulness, and judgementalism which enter our day-to-day lives? When we confess our sinfulness to God, his forgiveness releases us to experience a closer relationship with Christ.



**Standing in the Fire** Tom Doyle's book tells stories of modern-day heroes of the Christian faith who live in the Middle East. These former Muslims refuse to give in to their fear, no matter how difficult the circumstances. God's faithfulness in all situations is revealed in the book's testimonies of how God has shown his power to these believers. Christians are thriving in the dangerous corners of our world. Take heart: God is in your corner of the world as well, ready to show his power and goodness.



**All Saints** This book explores the true story of a struggling country church of 25 members that transforms as they cry out to God and then seek to live out in obedience what they hear God ask them to do. All Saints Church welcomes a group of refugees from Burma and, as a result, a story of community, faith, and miracles unfolds. As the Atlantic Provinces experience an influx of immigrants from across the globe, reading *All Saints* will spark the idea of potential if you are willing to step out of your comfort zone.
